

Pastor's Corner . . .

Dear Parishioners/Queridos Feligreses:

We have plenty to be proud and grateful for this Christmas. I am proud of us and grateful for us. By the grace of God, we were able to start and complete the construction of our beautiful new church. It truly is a Merry Christmas. Life may not be perfect, nothing may have gone completely our way; health many not be in tip top shape; no one may have ever been completely on our side, but our hearts carry a nagging gratitude because God is with us. He is Emmanuel. He has gifted our community with blessings, dreams that morphed into reality and the promise is fulfilled at the birth of the Christ for the salvation of the world. Isn't this the reason why Jesus the Christ was born? It is to bring us salvation, to the home not made by human hands.

When I hear the promise of salvation, I gaze to the heavens, our only and true home. Christmas reminds us to orient ourselves to that home. Jesus did not come to stay.
